

Public Library Assessments

In response to requests from libraries and library boards, the Winding Rivers Library System developed a comprehensive Public Library Assessment process to aid in planning and future improvements for member libraries. The assessment

process usually consists of two meetings (one with the library board and one with the library staff) where a series of questions are presented. Depending on the size of the library and need, an additional site visit may be scheduled. This has proven to be an effective approach, providing the assessors with a cross-section of viewpoints and information that offers insight into the relationships within the library community. The interviews are followed by a careful analysis of data that was gathered through the interviews, statewide library data comparisons, and a review of the historical trends for the library. The culmination of the process is the presentation of a written report that offers recommendations for future developments.
